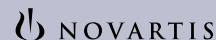

## FELINE MEDICINE & SURGERY FOR 2002

### Dr. Gary Norsworthy

The number of cats has continued to exceed the number of dogs in North American households. That translates to an increasing number of feline patients in almost all veterinary practices. Dr. Norsworthy will call on his vast experience with this species to help you be better prepared for your feline patients.

Dr. Norsworthy will spend six hours showing you: 1) how to perform important clinical procedures for this special species, and 2) how to diagnose and treat key feline diseases. You will learn new things about old diseases and get a better perspective on how to deal with many common feline maladies. This combination will allow you to grow the feline part of your practice, even if you do not want to limit your practice to cats. Your registration fee will be returned many times as you employ Dr. Norsworthy's approaches and techniques.

Procedures include: fine needle biopsy, enternal feeding (orogastric and esophagostomy tubes), cystocentesis, central venous catheter placement, rapid ECG, and the NEW subcutaneous fluid catheter. Videos will permit you to see the procedure in real time.

The emphasis will be on urinary diseases (chronic renal disease, hypertension, pyelonephritis); however, from these, Dr. Norsworthy will launch into several other important feline disease topics.



## ABOUT THE SPEAKERS



### Larry P. Tilley, DVM

Larry P. Tilley, DVM is a Diplomate in the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine. His achievements as an internist, educator, author, researcher, and entrepreneur have given him worldwide

distinction as one of the most accomplished members of the veterinary profession. Following eight years as head of the Cardiology Department of The Animal Medical Center, he established VetMed Telemedicine, a nationally renowned cardiology and internal medicine consulting firm. He is a pioneer in cardiology having authored over 200 journal articles, 22 chapters in books, and is the author or co-author of eight textbooks including The Five Minute Veterinary Consult, a new in-depth internal medicine book and CD-ROM that concisely addresses every disease of the dog and cat. He has been AAHA's Veterinarian of the year (1989), Animal Medical Center's Distinguished Alumnus (1992), and the International Waltham Award winner (1999) and was recognized as the "Speaker of the Year" in the Small Animal Category of the 1996 North American Veterinary Conference.



### Gary D. Norsworthy, DVM

Gary D. Norsworthy, DVM is a Diplomate of the Feline Practice Category of the American Board of Veterinary Practitioners. He began his career in a feline practice, spent 24 years in a small animal practice, and now is in a

feline practice again. He is the author of numerous papers and is the editor and primary author of Feline Practice, published in 1993. His second feline textbook, The Feline Patient, was published in 1998 and has been translated into three languages. He has lectured extensively throughout the United States and Canada and is in demand as a speaker because of his understanding of what is useful and practical in private practice. He was chosen the 1992 Companion Animal Practitioner of the Year by the Texas VMA and as 1997's Outstanding Alumnus of the College of Veterinary Medicine of Texas A&M. He was selected "Speaker of the Year" in the Small Animal and Veterinary Technician categories for the 1998 American Veterinary Conference.
